President Jim Gassert called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

Carmen Rinta moved to accept the minutes of the September 6, 2018 meeting. Bob Knauff seconded the motion and it carried.

Phil Lippo moved to accept the treasurers report with a balance of \$34,391.00. To date the raffle account has \$2,419.95.

The 2018 Raffle tickets were drawn. First prize was \$500.00 Kevin Turnock of McGregor, second prize was \$250.00 John Anderson of Wright, third prize was \$150.00 Debbie Eaton of Sturgeon Lake.

Darlene Turnock reported on the ATVAM Fall Ride and Rally. It was successful with around two hundred participants. Evergreen P.A.C. members helped with registration. The trails were a hit and the Handicap Ride was well received. Franklin Turnock moved to share the Handicap Ride lunch expense with Carlton County Riders ATV Club for \$260.00. Cindy Knauff seconded the motion and it carried.

Aitkin County Alliance will meet in Lawler next week. (It was postponed until November 20, 2018.)

The DNR approved 1.8 million to build a trail on the east side of Mille Lacs Lake in Aitkin and Mille Lacs counties. It would connect Isle to Malmo and to the Soo Line. There are matching funds that need to be raised.

The logger will be in the Soo Pits in Moose Lake in November. He will fix the road, so we won't need Gasserts cat.

The Brown Road will wait until it freezes.

The Evergreen Club bought class 5 that was delivered and spread. The City of Moose Lake will level it.

There was a question on the bike trail in Moose Lake, but Jim assured us it was a non-issue as it's a multi-use bike trail and the Carlton County is dealing with it.

Carmen Rinta noted Conservation Officer Mike Lee isn't available in October, November is deer hunting, December has Christmas activities, so the Instructor Training will have to wait until January or February of 2019. Dates to consider are January 18<sup>th</sup> or February 8<sup>th</sup>. She noted codes are still available in packets of twenty-five.

The Evergreen P.A.C. ATV Club is going to request \$1,000.00 for Youth Training from Lake Country Power in the spring quarter.

Carlton County Riders noted they receive money from Sappi and the new year has started now. Eric will send information to Darlene. He also noted they have a fund raiser on October 6<sup>th</sup> for Lids 4 Kids.

There is a power point presentation with the packet for ATV training. We need to check into it for training and the Carlton County Fair.

The Christmas Party in January was discussed. Darlene Turnock will check on dates, places, and prices and will report back at the November meeting.
